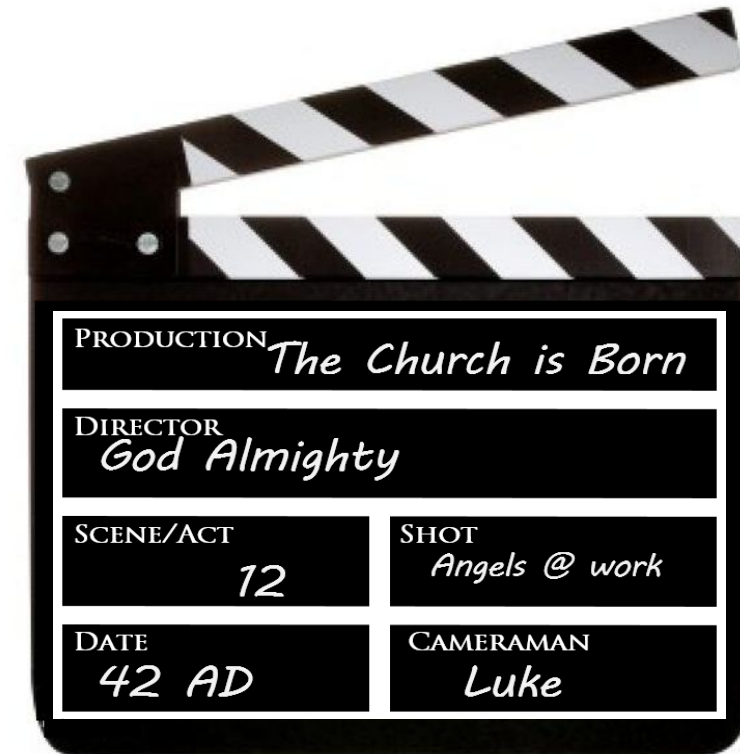

**The Collect**

O God, you have brought us near to an innumerable company of angels, and to the spirits of just men made perfect: Grant us during our earthly pilgrimage to abide in their fellowship, and in our heavenly country to become partakers of their joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

**First Lesson—Acts of the Apostles 12:1-19**

About that time King Herod cruelly attacked some who belonged to the church, <sup>2</sup>and he killed James, John's brother, with the sword. <sup>3</sup>When he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter too, during the days of Unleavened Bread. <sup>4</sup>After the arrest, he put him in prison and assigned four squads of four soldiers each to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. <sup>5</sup>So Peter was kept in prison, but prayer was being made earnestly to God for him by the church. <sup>6</sup>On the night before Herod was to bring him out for execution, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while the sentries in front of the door guarded the prison. <sup>7</sup>Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared, and a light shone in the cell. Striking Peter on the side, he woke him up and said, "Quick, get up!" Then the chains fell off his wrists. <sup>8</sup>"Get dressed," the angel told him, "and put on your sandals." And he did so. "Wrap your cloak around you," he told him, "and follow me." <sup>9</sup>So he went out and followed, and he did not know that what took place through the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. <sup>10</sup>After they passed the first and second guard posts, they came to the iron gate that leads into the city, which opened to them by itself. They went outside and passed one street, and immediately the angel left him. <sup>11</sup>Then Peter came to himself and said, "Now I know for certain that the Lord has sent His angel and rescued me from Herod's grasp and from all that the Jewish people expected." <sup>12</sup>When he realized this, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John Mark, where many had assembled and were praying. <sup>13</sup>He knocked at the door in the gateway, and a servant named Rhoda came to answer. <sup>14</sup>She recognized Peter's voice, and because of her joy, she did not open the gate but ran in and announced that Peter was standing at the gateway. <sup>15</sup>"You're crazy!" they told her. But she kept insisting that it was true. Then they said, "It's his angel!" <sup>16</sup>Peter, however, kept on knocking, and when they opened the door and saw him, they were astounded. <sup>17</sup>Motioning to them with his hand to be silent, he explained to them how the Lord had brought him out of the prison. "Report these things to James and the brothers," he said. Then he departed and went to a different place. <sup>18</sup>At daylight, there was a great commotion among the soldiers as to what could have become of Peter. <sup>19</sup>After Herod had searched and did not find him, he interrogated the guards and ordered their execution. Then Herod went down from Judea to Caesarea and stayed there.

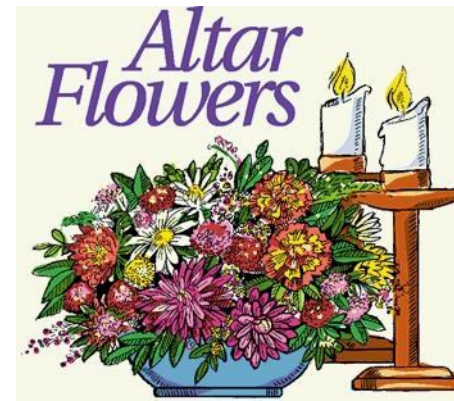

While we are in the weakest months of the year, our income was pretty good. However our expenses were up caused principally by a yearly charge for wind and hail insurance. I still have a concern regarding pledges. We are about \$25,000.00 below what we expected in Pledge Payments. Please review your pledge giving. The Vestry will monitor the budget very closely and make adjustments as required. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide us and with God's Grace we will follow his plan for All Saints.

The BB&T Loan Balance for our Church is \$363,525.44. The **Reduce the Debt Campaign** has been well received. If you would like to contribute to the campaign over your normal contribution simply put **Reduce the Debt** on your check or envelope and help reduce our Loan Principal. Please don't feel that the amount needs to be large. Every dollar helps.

As a point of clarification, if you contribute to the **Building Fund**, those monies are reserved for future construction at All Saints. If you contribute to **Reduce the Debt Campaign**, you are helping reduce the principal on the loan that was borrowed to build our Church

### Second Lesson—Hebrews 1:1-5; 13-14

In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, <sup>2</sup>but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. <sup>3</sup>The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. <sup>4</sup>So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs. <sup>5</sup>For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; to-day I have become your Father"? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? ... <sup>13</sup>To which of the angels did God ever say, "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet"? <sup>14</sup>Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?

Based on actual events from 1956 in which five missionaries were speared by a group of the Waodani tribe, the movie tells the story from the perspective of Steve Saint (the son of Nate Saint, one of the missionaries killed in the encounter), and Mincayani, one of the tribesmen who took part in the attack. The two eventually form a bond that continues to this day.
